SUBBING DURING YOUR PREP TIME

In September, the MOU giving teachers their hourly rate if they choose to sub during their prep time was signed for the 2023-2024 school year.

This is great news for those of you who wish to make a little extra money!

This does not mean you have to sub! You still have the right to say "No, thank you." when asked.

If you wish to know exactly how much you hourly rate is in order to determine if you want to sub, here is how you can do it:

- 1. Log in to Skyward a link can be found on the district website staff page
- a. https://www.isd622.org/login
- b. Under "Frequently Used Resources"
- c. Click on "Employee Information" Middle purple box at top left
- d. Click on "Personal Information"

Under "Personnel" click on "Assignments"

If can't see, click the purple arrow to the left of "Personnel" so it points downward

5. Click the purple arrow to the left of "TEACHER" to open dropdown menu

Click on "Payroll Information"

Both your daily rate and your hourly rate are listed.

If you have TEACHER LONGEVITY, follow steps 5 and 6 for that line item also

To calculate your total hourly rate, simply add the hourly amount from TEACHER LONGEVITY to the hourly amount from TEACHER

Four Elements for Creating a Positive Learning Environment

Safety: Before students can succeed academically, they must feel safe, both physically and mentally.

Engagement: Recent Gallup data shows a troubling trend—as students move through the K–12 education system, they become increasingly less engaged. **Personalized learning** is one instructional approach that could reverse these trends. This student-centered approach to learning tailors instruction to students' unique strengths and needs and engages them in challenging, standards-based academic content

Connectedness: Students must feel connected to teachers, staff, and other students. Schools can nurture these connections by focusing on students' social and emotional learning

Support: Students must feel supported by all those connected to their learning experience. This includes teachers, classmates, administrators, family, and community members.
