Contract Corner

YOUR 22-23 Teacher Contract

Usually in August, the district emails out a contract summary form to each individual teacher. That did not happen this year, but it will be occurring in the hopefully near future.

In the meantime, if you wish to check that your own contract information is entered into Skyward correctly, here is how you can do it:

- 1. Log in to Skyward a link can be found on the district website
- a. Resources Staff Resources under "Frequently Used Links"
- 2. Click on "Employee Information" Middle purple box at top left

3. Click on "Personal Information"

Under "Personnel" click on "Assignments"

If can't see, click the purple arrow to the left of "Personnel" so it points downward

4. Click the purple arrow to the left of "TEACHER" to open dropdown menu

Click on "Salary Information"

Check your Lane and Step information here

- If you have additional paid duties, they should be under "Add-ons"
- 6. If you have TEACHER LONGEVITY, follow steps 5 and 6 for that line item also

Click on "Salary Information"

Your Lane should say "LONG"

Your Step should say your level of longevity

Since teachers again earn their hourly rate when covering another class during their prep time, you can also find your hourly rate in this same area. At step 6 above click on "Payroll Information". Your hourly salary will be listed with this information. Remember if you have longevity to add the two amounts together to get your total hourly salary.

Tips for the new school year

Let go of last year. Start this year fresh.

Shift your classroom layout from last school year. Keeping things fresh helps to motivate you.
